 - A. Strategic Planning (H. Hellmuth)
 - i. New position statements on Positive Reinforcement and Enrichment have been approved by the board and can be found on our website.
 - Positive Reinforcement- "The Animal Behavior Management Alliance (ABMA), in support of our core values, endorses the use of positive reinforcement as our most effective and ethical method of behavior modification for all taxa. A science-based, proactive, positive reinforcement training program reduces fear and stress, resulting in enhanced animal welfare."
 - 2. Enrichment- "The Animal Behavior Management Alliance (ABMA), in support of our core values, believes that a comprehensive enrichment program is an essential element of animal care. Enrichment programs should be based on the natural history and behavior of the species and the individual animal. Enrichment should be goal-based, evaluated for safety and effectiveness, offer choice and control, and provide opportunities to utilize natural abilities. A comprehensive enrichment program is integral for the optimal physical and psychological health and welfare of all animals in human care."
 - ii. Vision A new vision statement has been approved by the board: "To be a global leader dedicated to advancing animal welfare through excellence in behavior management."
 - iii. Strategic Initiatives Strategic planning happens about every 5 years to keep the organization moving forward. The board and committee members are working on several strategic initiatives. Some have been defined, others are still being clarified but those include:
 - 1. Sharing knowledge to expand care taker's expertise regardless of species or facility
 - 2. Align/connect with like-minded organizations
